

The Toronto-based electronic composer and singer-songwriter Lydia Ainsworth completed graduate school in 2012: She studied with Joan La Barbara at NYU and composed a score for a 50-piece orchestra at McGill. She taught herself cello at the age of 10 and cites Verdi's Requiem, Bulgarian folks music, and Bernard Herrmann (along with Ace of Base and Art of Noise) as influences. But while her

haunting dark pop feels smart and carefully pieced together (think Bat for Lashes stoked on Philip Glass), it's never overly academic. Ainsworth released her assured, orchestral debut album, Right From Real, on Arbutus last year, and has since covered Chris Isaak's Wicked Games. If David Lynch hasn't taken notice yet, he should.



Though the Austin punk scene is perhaps best known for its more garage leaning acts, over the past few years a number of groups have managed to stand out by virtue of their embrace and enhancement of the weirdest qualities of the first wave of British post-punk bands. One of the most potent of these upstarts is Institute, who released their Salt EP at the tail end of last year on hip New York label Sacred Bones. A startling collection of rugged rhythms, shrapnel sharp guitar and vocals that forgo lyricism and melody in favor of mush mouthed murderous rants, Salt commands attention, forcing ears to perk up in curious horror. Institute aren't some post-punk throwback, they're a monstrous mutation.

Pharmakon continued to make waves last year with her Bestial Burden LP; though written from the constraint of a hospital bed, she incredibly alchemized the first-hand frailty of the human body into one of 2014's fiercest, most uncompromising releases. Chardiet's ability to replicate this energy nightly results in a live show that commands attention. Expect oppressive decibel levels, audience confrontation, and a large piece of scrap metal with a microphone taped to it.

Far from a bout of nostalgia, however, the songs pulse with new wave synth hooks and sky-reaching choruses that wrap the styles of the past in a modern-cut leather jacket. Lewis delivers an abundance of lovelorn crooning as well as stadium-sized anthems with earnestness. It's all demonstrative of a revitalized confidence the artist has uncovered in his music, something that had been slowly chipped away over the cycle of his first two full-lengths despite their warm receptions. Now, once again comfortable in the skin he wears and with a fresh creative drive, Lewis and Twin Shadow are gunning towards the top.

Last year, swedish pop artist Elliphant hit the music scene as if she was the Cara Delevigne of Pop. Diplo and Skrillex are her BFFs, sometimes she gets shit-faced with her buddy MØ, and back in L.A. she is usually working with Dr. Luke (Know the guy? He's just the chart-topping megaproducer behind Katy Perry, Ke\$ha and Britney). Although being often compared to popstars like M.I.A. - solitary, badass,

Cathedrals released their debut EP last year on Neon Gold Records and tracks like slow burner "Want My Love" and infectious "Harlem", which are both buoyed by Ms. Jenkins' affecting alto and forward-thinking production, indicate a band with both terrific potential and a tremendous penchant for pop songwriting.



Athens, Georgia-based Futurebirds are a badass live band that have brought fresh, energetic and original southern-rock to such festivals as Bonnaroo, Forecastle, Austin City Limits and Outside Lands. The band's unique vibe is founded upon the fact that Thomas Johnson, Daniel Womack and Carter King all provide strikingly original vocals that demonstrate their stylistic versatility. Their 2013 album "Baba Yaga," released on Fat Possum Records, defies categorization as it combines experimental, ambient soundscapes with alt-rock foundations and mellow harmonies. Their new album, recorded in 2014, will be released later this year. Their set at SXSW will feature classics and new offerings. Futurebirds, like the mythical Phoenix, rise from the ashes every year with exciting, cutting-edge and truly innovative material.
