



Narrative Filmmaker Mentor: Dash Donato


Lisa "Dash" Donato (they/she) is an award-winning director (D.G.A), screenwriter, and producer. Her feature directorial debut, Gossamer Folds, was nominated for "Outstanding Picture" at the GLAAD Media Awards (2022), earned her the "Best New Director" at the Brooklyn Film Festival, and is now available on AppleTV, Amazon Prime, and Vudu. They co-wrote the feature film, Signature Move, which world-premiered at SXSW and can now be found on HBOMax and most major streaming platforms. She directed a Telly-winning DocuSeries about drag culture in the US called Behind The Drag which showcases the real lives of American drag queens. Their short and feature films have been screened at hundreds of film festivals worldwide since 2015, including Cannes, SXSW, Tribeca, Outfest, Frameline, and Bentonville.

Entrepreneurship Mentor: Ruby Taylor

Ruby "SunShine" Taylor, MSW, is the UnConventional CEO and Founder of Financial Joy School. Financial Joy School is a virtual educational platform and gaming company that provides diverse financial education and investment tools to Black and Brown youth and their families. Ruby is a double HBCU alumna (Howard University and Virginia Union University) and advocates for closing the racial wealth gap to make our world more financially equitable. She harnesses the power of financial knowledge to bring connections, application, and education to establish generational wealth for ALL families. A traumatic brain injury survivor, Ruby is a disabled Black, lesbian, ex-wife, mother, daughter, aunt, sister, and friend who is driven to make our world more equal, joyful, and just. She is a motivational speaker and has partnered with financial brands, including Wells Fargo, Trust & Will, Nasdaq Entrepreneurial Center and has been featured in several leading publications, including The Motley Fool, Inc.com, Fast Company, Forbes, Black Enterprise, Mashable.com and more. Ruby is releasing her much awaited book "The UnConventional CEO: How to Build Wealth & Joy In The Face of Adversity."

Narrative Spotlight

A Nice Indian Boy

Starring Jonathan Groff, Karan Soni

Doctor Naveen Gavaskar meets Jay Kurundkar, a white man adopted by two Indian parents, and the two quickly fall in love. Eventually, Jay has to meet the Gavaskars, who have never met a boyfriend of Naveen's.

• Cuckoo

Starring Hunter Schafer

On a trip to the German Alps with her father and stepmother, Gretchen discovers that the resort town where they're staying hides sinister secrets. Soon, Gretchen finds herself pulled into a conspiracy involving bizarre experiments by the resort's owner that echo back generations.

• <u>Turtles</u>

As Thom and Henri drift away from each other a little more each day, Thom will do anything to save his relationship and rekindle their love, even if that means asking Henri for a divorce.

I Wish You All The Best

Based on Mason Deaver's novel, the film follows Ben DeBacker, a non-binary teen who is thrown out of their house and forced to move in with their estranged older sister, Hannah, and her husband, Thomas.

<u>High Tide</u>

Heartbroken and adrift, undocumented Brazilian immigrant Lourenço searches for purpose in the queer mecca of Provincetown. Lourenço encounters Maurice, and despite their vastly different backgrounds, the two men find a common bond in their shared feelings of alienation and loneliness.

I Don't Understand You

An American couple, on the verge of adopting a baby, goes on an Italian vacation — an opportunity to reconnect before the new addition arrives. Everything is picture-perfect; the epitome of a European baby moon, when things begin to spiral out of control.

Festival Favorites (Narratives)

• <u>Toll</u>

Suellen falls in with a gang of thieves and realizes she can use her job to raise some extra money illegally for a so-called noble cause: to send her son to an expensive gay conversion workshop led by a renowned foreign priest.

<u>Backspot</u>

Riley is the formidable backspot on her mid-level cheerleading squad until professional coach Eileen McNamara gives her an opportunity to join the Thunderhawks, a high performance All Star team. Overwhelmed, obsessive and with a competition looming, this young, queer athlete must decipher her own voice from the women around her.

• The Queen of My Dreams

The sudden death of her father sends queer Muslim grad student Azra flying back to Pakistan, where her stern mother Mariam demands she play the role of the perfect grieving daughter. But through flashbacks to Mariam's own life, we see the connections uniting mother and daughter, starting with their shared love of the Bollywood star Sharmila Tagore.

• <u>I Saw The TV Glow</u>

Teenager Owen is just trying to make it through life in the suburbs when his classmate introduces him to a mysterious late-night TV show — a vision of a supernatural world beneath their own. In the pale glow of the television, Owen's view of reality begins to crack.

Narrative Feature Competition

We Were Dangerous

Nellie and Daisy attempt to escape the institution for delinquent girls in 1954 New Zealand but are relocated to a facility on a remote island. Joined by Lou, life on the island takes shape as a sense of doom settles in when experimental forms of punishment take place in the dead of night.

Documentary Features

• A House Is Not A Disco

"A House Is Not A Disco" documents a year-in-the-life in the world's most iconic "homo-normative" community: Fire Island Pines. Situated fifty miles from New York City, this storied queer beach town finds itself in the midst of a renaissance as a new generation of Millennial homeowners reimagine The Pines for a new, more inclusive era.

Love Machina

LOVE MACHINA follows the stranger-than-fiction love story of Martine and Bina Rothblatt, futurists who believe through technology we can build a better future for humanity. The documentary explores Martine and Bina's optimistic vision that there's a point in the future where digital consciousness, space settlement and these different technologies will converge to radically change life as we know it.

• <u>We Can Be Heroes</u>

Sometimes, finding your tribe requires a bit of magic. For attendees of a live action role-playing (LARP) camp in upstate New York, the deeply accepting environment has given neurodivergent, queer, and self-proclaimed "nerdy" teenagers the space for self-discovery.

Any Other Way: The Jackie Shane Story

"Any Other Way: The Jackie Shane Story" reveals the extraordinary rise to fame, sudden disappearance, and resurgence of trailblazing Black trans soul singer Jackie Shane.

• <u>Hello Stranger</u>

At the crossroads of documentary and fiction, Hello Stranger relates the transition journey of a young trans woman named Cooper Josephine. With humor, the film revisits key moments of her life from her childhood in a small fishing village of the east coast of Canada to her tumultuous medical process.



Documentary Features (More!)

• The World According to Allee Willis

Award-winning songwriter / artist Allee Willis began filming her life in 1950s Detroit and never stopped. This film is the realization of her wish that her "final art piece be someone putting together the trail I have left behind."

• Roleplay

Faced with rampant sexual violence on their college campus, a group of Tulane University students spend a year creating an immersive play from their real-life experiences.

<u>Billy Preston: That's The Way God Planned It</u>

Explore Billy's career and influence on generations of musicians, as he scored several number one hits of his own and became one of the most sought-after musicians in the world.

<u>Doppelgängers³</u>

"Doppelgängers³" draws on the experience of diasporas to challenge the commercialisation of the moon. The film culminates in an analog space mission in a deep cave in Spain in which we see a moon utopia, but things do not go according to plan.





Documentary Short

Wouldn't Make It Any Other Way

Having built a colorful life in Iowa, a costume designer returns to their island hometown, Guam, to make costumes for a children's theater show and reconnect with distanced parents.

Narrative Short

• The Robbers

Three trans women meet in a country house to plan a robbery and in order to create a false trail, they disguise themselves as men. They practice behaving in a masculine manner, but in this process, they reach their emotional and physical limits and repeatedly fail to imitate male connoted behavior.

XR Experience

• <u>Her Name Was Gisberta</u>

"Her Name Was Gisberta" is a VR documentary that portrays the life and death of Gisberta Salce, a Brazilian Trans woman murdered by 14 young men in the city of Porto (Portugal) in 2006.




